ELIGIBILITY & APPLICATION

1. Any student currently enrolled in any school (home school included) or college/university in Richland/ Lexington County is eligible to compete. Teachers are not required to be a member of one of the two music clubs.
2. Competition is limited to students in grade 6 through College Junior. **AGE LIMIT IS 25!**
3. Students may enter up to TWO Categories, but may not be chosen a winner in the same Category in the same Division for 2 consecutive years. An application and fee are required for each category.
4. An entering student must be in at least his/her second year of study.
5. Application forms may be obtained from the scholarship chairman and must be postmarked no later than Jan. **19, 2019**. No applications will be accepted after this date.
6. A registration fee of \$20.00 must accompany each application. Make check payable to the "**Music Clubs Scholarship Fund.**"
7. **Failure to follow guidelines and AUDITION/PERFORMANCE TIME ALLOTMENTS will disqualify entrant.**
8. ALL WINNERS are expected to perform on the **Scholarship Winners Recital at Columbia College on Sunday, Feb. 17, 2019 at 3:00 p.m.** Winners must secure their accompanist. Performances should not be longer than: **5 minutes for Solo; 8 min. for Intermediate Concerti; & 10 minutes for Secondary/Senior Concerti. TIME LIMITS ARE TO BE ADHERED TO STRICTLY!**
9. For the Recital, winners in 2 categories will play only **one selection** not to exceed the time limit in #8.
10. **RICE MUSIC HOUSE winners** will also perform again at Rice Music House on **Sunday, March 31, 2019 at 3:00 pm.**

CATEGORIES & DIVISIONS/PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIPS

1. Piano Solo (4 Divisions): Intermediate (gr.6-8); Secondary (gr.9-11); Senior (gr.12); Collegiate (Freshman-Junior)
 One scholarship of \$200 will be awarded in each division of Intermediate & Secondary;
 \$400 awarded in both Senior Division and Collegiate Division.

2. Piano Concerto (3 Divisions): Intermediate (gr.6-8); Secondary (gr.9-11); Senior (gr.12)
 One scholarship of \$200 will be awarded in each division of Intermediate & Secondary;
 \$400 awarded in Senior Division.

NOTE: Four (possibly five) Rice Music House Scholarships of \$150 each will be awarded in any Division of Piano. [See # 10 above]

3. Voice (2 Divisions): Senior (gr. 12); Collegiate (Freshman-Junior)
 One scholarship of \$400 will be awarded in both Senior Division and Collegiate Division.

4. Instrumental/ Classical Guitar (4 Divisions): Intermediate (gr. 6-8); Secondary (gr. 9-11); Senior (gr. 12); Collegiate (Freshman-Junior)
 One scholarship of \$200 will be awarded in each division of Intermediate & Secondary.
 \$400 awarded in both Senior Division and in Collegiate Division.

5. Organ Organists may contact Brenda Dean. Location of auditions: TBA (not at Columbia College)

PREPARATION OF STUDENTS

1. Music chosen for audition shall be selected from acceptable recital and teaching literature. Entrants must have at least 2 contrasting pieces. Only 1 piece is required for Piano Concerto.
2. Maximum audition time for Intermediate Divisions, including Solo and Piano Concerto, is 8 minutes.
 Maximum audition time for Secondary, Senior & Collegiate Divisions, including Solo and Piano Concerto, is 10 minutes.
3. Memorization is required in all piano and voice divisions. Other divisions may use music scores.
4. When necessary, entrant must provide an accompanist. Teachers may accompany concerti.
5. **The student must present his/her published scores at Registration.** Measures must be numbered and pages marked for the judge. **No photocopied music is allowed** (including accompanist's music), unless permission is given by the publisher. Electronic scores are allowed if legally purchased from on-line vendors or music stores. The Audition Chairman has the final decision.

JUDGES

1. There will usually be 1-2 judges in Instrumental, 2-3 judges in Piano, 1 judge in Voice.
2. Only the entrant, the judge, an assistant to the judge, and an accompanist (when necessary) shall be present during the audition.
3. Judges will not stop a performance unless maximum performing time has expired.
4. Judges will announce the winners.
5. Judges will write critiques of the performance, addressing musical skills, appropriate interpretation, style, etc....
6. Judges' rating sheets will be turned in to the scholarship chairman who will distribute them only to the teacher.
 Exception: Collegiate winners should receive their own critique sheets.
7. Awards will be given at the discretion of the judge and available funding.
